How much do you know about Salzburg?

We start and finish our little tour here:

Alter Markt

1. On Alter Markt there is an unusual building.
Write down what is special about the building and what is sold in it.
(Clue: you have to look closely to find it)

2. Not far from there is Salzburg's oldest café.
What's it called?

3. Opposite, there is another café where a delicious sweet was created.
What is the name of this café, which sweet are we referring to and when was it created?
(Clue: you will find the history in a shop window to the left of the entrance)

Now walk on to the Residenzplatz.

4. There you will find a building where Salzburg's rulers used to reside.
What is this stately building called? **(Clue: the square is named after it)**

5. Three times a day – at 7 am, 11 am and 6 pm – you can hear a lovely melody on this square.
Where does this music come from? **(Clue: it is neither the street musicians nor the Cathedral)**

6. The Residenzplatz is also the starting point for the popular horse-drawn carriage rides.
What is the local name for these horse-drawn carriages?

Here's some space to draw your favourite horse:

Now continue through the Cathedral arches onto the Domplatz in front of the Cathedral.

7. There are four statues along the front around the entrance.
Who is the statue on the far left?
Why is this man so important for Salzburg?

8. Which famous play is performed annually in front of the Cathedral at the Salzburg Festival?
(Clue: the name is known to every man, woman and child in Salzburg)

Now leave the Domplatz and walk through the other set of arches onto the Kapitelplatz.

9. On this square there is a large sphere.
What colour is it and what is on top of it?

Stay on the Kapitelplatz for a bit longer.

10. From here you have an excellent view of Hohensalzburg Fortress.
Which "animal" "roars" from there three times a day – at 7 am, 11 am and 6 pm?

Keep to the right. At the far end of the square there is a wrought-iron gate leading to St. Peter's cemetery.

11. Just behind the gate to the left is a traditional craft business.
What is produced there?

12. What is the name of the stream coming out of the mountain there, where does it flow and what did it used to be used for?

Now turn right and walk across the cemetery.

13. If you look closely, you will see little "windows" along the Mönchsberg mountain.
What is concealed behind them?

Walk through the archway into the courtyard of St. Peter's monastery.

14. On the outside wall of one of the building there is a picture of an old man with a raven and a book. There is a metal rod protruding from the wall.
What is that?

Now leave the courtyard towards the Franziskanergasse.

15. Which church does this side entrance belong to?

Walk across the Max-Reinhardt-Platz to the fountain.

16. In the middle of the fountain there is a statue of a "wild man".
What items is he holding?

Follow the Hofstallgasse until the end.

17. The square at the end of the Hofstallgasse is named after another famous Salzburger.
What is his name and profession?

18. On this square there is a large water basin surrounded with magnificent murals.
What is it called and what did it used to be used for?

19. Look around – also on this square, there are two hotels/restaurants named after "different-coloured" animals.
What are they called?

Now turn right and cross the Universitätsplatz. At the end, turn left and walk through the "Schatz"-passage to the Getreidegasse.

20. Before you get to the Getreidegasse, take a good look at the ceiling.
Which animal is caught in a net up there?

21. Which number of the Getreidegasse is the birthplace of Salzburg's most famous son?
Who was born there?

22. What are the signs called that hang above the shops in the Getreidegasse?

Leave the Getreidegasse via the Hanuschplatz towards the river Salzach.

23. There, just by the Marko-Feingold-Steg [bridge], is the landing stage of the Salzburg Salzach boat. What is it called? Who was it named after?

Now cross the Marko-Feingold-bridge and go to the Mirabell Gardens.

24. On the left, there is a tree-lined alley named after its trees. What is it called?

25. Behind the hedges there is a theatre which often features traditional events. What is this theatre called?

26. Now look for the fountain with the "winged" horse. What is this horse called?

Behind the fountain there is a staircase with two lions.**Go up it and across into the Salzburger Zwergelgarten [dwarf garden].**

27. How many stone statues are there?

Now walk into Mirabell Palace. On the floor in the foyer you will see a large-scale aerial view of Salzburg.

28. How many bridges are there across the river Salzach?

Leaving the foyer to the left, you will get to the famous angel staircase leading up to the marble hall on the first floor.

29. How many angels are on the banister all the way to the top?

Leave the Mirabell Gardens where you came in. You are now on the Makartplatz.

30. Whose residence is located on this square?

Walk along the Makartplatz towards the Holy Trinity Church and turn right through the Dreifaltigkeitsgasse into the Linzer Gasse. Turn left onto the Linzer Gasse and walk up to St. Sebastian's church.

31. There is a cemetery next to the church. Find the grave of the Mozart family there.
Which members of the Mozart family are buried there?
Where is Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's grave?

32. Another famous Salzburger, uncle of Prince-Archbishop Markus Sittikus, also found his final resting place here.
What was his name? **(Clue: you can't miss this burial site)**

Now walk back down the Linzer Gasse, cross the Platzl square and the Staatsbrücke bridge, walk across the Kranzmarkt and left into Getreidegasse / Alter Markt. On the facade of the Rathausturm [tower of the town hall] you will see a blue and yellow ball.

33. What does this ball indicate?

You're almost done.

Turn left down the Getreidegasse to your starting point on Alter Markt.

There's one more question to answer though:

34. How many corners does the fountain in the middle of the square have?
